*Bailey’s Harbor Boreal Forest, Door County:* Baileys Harbor Boreal Forest and Wetlands contains a unique and diverse landscape permitting northern species and a boreal forest to thrive. Extensive alkaline rock shore, or bedrock beach, is exposed during periods of low lake levels.
